- The native language of Uruguay is Spanish.
- The capital city of Uruguay is Montevideo.
- The population of Uruguay is approximately 3.3 million.

- Norway is on the continent on Europe.
- The native language of Norway is Norwegian.
- The capital city of Norway is Oslo.
- The population of Norway is approximately 5.4 million.
- Norway has around 400,000 lakes.



**Vocabulary**

Word	Meaning
Country	A nation with its own government.
Continent	The world's largest expanses of land.
Physical features	Bodies such as seas, mountains and rivers which are natural. They would be here even if there were no people around.
Human features	Things like houses, roads and bridges. They have been built by people.
Landscape	The visible features of an area of land, its lands forms and how they integrate with natural or man made features.
Tourist	A person who visits another place or country where they don't reside.
Population	All the inhabitants of a particular place.
Native	A person born in a specified place or associated with a place by birth, whether resident there or not.
